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



### Road Safety – A Global Concern


- \*1.2 million deaths globally in 2002
- \*85 % in developing countries
- **★70%** of the fatalities are of the vulnerable
- **★**Privation for families and economic loss for countries






### Successful Interventions

- \* Political commitment
- \* A Road Safety policy and strategy
- \* An appropriate legal and regulatory framework
- \* A Safe system approach
- Coordination and better management lead agency
- \* Adequate Funding

Reiterated by the World Report 2004



### Developing Countries - Current Scenario

- Lack of commitment and policy Road safety not a priority
- **★Weak regulatory framework**
- \*Fragmented institutional responsibility
- \*Inadequate funding
- \*Lack of expertise; interventions not based on country specific research and data



### India – Moving Forward

- **★Increasing road related morbidity and mortality** 
  - a major public health issue
- \*Rising equity concerns
- \*Major investments on roads, increase in vehicles, rapid urbanisation more accidents
- \*A concerned Govt. appoints an expert Committee on Road Safety and Traffic Management



### Committee's recommendations-Policy

- **★Political commitment to reduce accidents**and fatalities
- \*A National Road Safety Policy to commit a significant improvement in Road Safety through:
  - -Raising awareness
  - -Establishing a road safety database
  - -Safe road use
  - -Safe road infrastructure
  - -Safe vehicles



### Road Safety Policy (Contd.)

- \*Road safety education & training
- **\***Enforcement of safety laws
- **\*Better medical services for road accidents**
- \*Research in road safety
- \*Appropriate legal and Institutional arrangements

A strategy for implementation



### Committee's Recommendations— Institutional

\*A National Road Safety and Traffic Management Board, with adequate expertise, autonomy and funds.

**★**State Road Safety and Traffic Management Boards in all the states



### Functions of the Board



# 1. Road User Behavior strategies, public awareness and education

- Promote road safety education and awareness amongst all user groups
- Recognize NGOs working in the area

### 2. Traffic Management and Enforcement

- Encourage state govts. to implement laws for helmet use, seat-belt use, drunken driving, etc.
- Encourage state govts. to computerize details regarding vehicle and driver licensing
- Set guidelines for driver training and testing
- Recommend safety standards and infrastructure for nonmotorized transport



### 3. Road Engineering and Construction

- Set / approve road safety standards
- Conduct / commission
   Road safety audits at all stages
- Conduct / commissionBlack spot treatment
- Recommend traffic calming

#### 4. Vehicle Safety Design

- Set Safety standards
- Conduct / commission vehicle safety audits



## 5. Crash investigation, data collection and analysis

- Establish procedures for data collection, transmission, analyses at various levels
- Maintain a comprehensive database
- Establish procedures and centres for Multidisciplinary crash investigations

## 6. Knowledge Production, Research and Institutional Linkages

- Identify areas & subjects for relevant research
- Commission research projects
- Create linkages between institutions at local, regional and national level



### 7. Post-trauma Medical care

- Set guidelines to establish grid of trauma care centres
- Set guidelines to create a grid of medical and paramedical facilities for dealing with highway injuries
- Emphasize pre-hospital care and rehabilitation

### 8. Capacity Building & Training

Set guidelines for building capacity and skills in the traffic police, hospitals, highway authorities, NGOs and other organizations involved with road safety



### Other Functions...

- Enter into agreements with state governments, monitor compliance
- \* Recommend policies to Government
- Administer the National Road Safety Fund
- \* Liaise with other agencies-education, health, etc.
- Liaise with international agencies and other countries



### National Road Safety Fund

- \* A minimum of 1% of the revenue from the cess on diesel and gasoline allocated for national highways and railways to be credited to the Fund
- \* Fund to be utilised for the activities of the Board
- \*At least 50% of the receipts to be allocated to accident prone urban areas and states
- \* Allocation to the states conditional upon their entering into agreements with the centre and fulfilling their commitments



### Road Safety and Traffic Management Boards in the States

- **\*Road Safety Boards in the states**
- \*Functions of the State Boards include specifying standards for roads other than national highways; State boards also to assist the National board in the discharge of its functions



### State Road Safety Fund

\*A minimum of 1% of the states' share of the cess on diesel and gasoline to be credited into the state fund

\*Fund to be used for the activities of the Board



### Committee's Recommendations-Legal

A comprehensive "National Road Safety and Traffic Management Act" drafted to:

- \*encompass the provisions related to road safety in other Acts
- \*establish a National Road Safety and Traffic Management Board with designated functions and enable setting up of Boards in the States
- \*Establish a National Road Safety Fund and enable establishing similar funds in the states
