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


Road Safety Crisis


- Over 1.35 million people die globally every year (60% in ESCAP region)
- 2. Up to 50 million injuries
- 3. 8th Leading cause of death for all ages
- 4. Economic cost and social impacts As high as 6% of national GDPs
- 5. Preventable and predictable man-made problems.
- 6. In 2016, one person killed in every 38 seconds in the ESCAP Region (In 2013, 43 seconds).

Lack of Quality Data

- WHO data
 - Once every three years
 - Reported verses estimated
- Road crash data
 - Inconsistency among countries
 - Under-reporting
 - III informed decisions





Road Safety Observatory (RSO) examples:

- Ibero American Road Safety Observatory (OISEVI), established since 2012.
- Africa Road Safety Observatory (ARSO), established since 2018.
- 3. Middle East Road Safety Observatory, under development since 2019.

Supported by international development partners: WB, ITF, FIA, WHO & ECA



RSO - Concept

A regional platform for members to deliberate on road safety data, and develop road safety data-related evidence-based policies and practices in the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals.

- A network of government representatives
- Share experiences, data and information
- Co-operation
- Conduct joint studies



Opportunities

- A new and innovative approach on Road Safety in the region.
- Enhanced engagement with countries.
- Access to higher quality road crash data.
- Assist member countries to develop evidence-based road safety policies, which could inform future road safety resolutions proposed by member States at future Committee on Transport (2020) and/or the Ministerial Conference on Transport (2021).
- Access to international financing support
