<p>Goods:</p> <p>If you enter Denmark in connection with the transportation of freight you are exempt from the testing requirement. This applies to both the requirement to present a negative test* before entry and the requirement to obtain a test in connection with entry. This applies both to persons who are and who are not resident in Denmark.</p> <p>Measures regarding isolation** for persons who enter Denmark for the purpose of freight transport depends whether the person is vaccinated, previously infected with COVID-19 or travelling on a test. Please see table 1, 2 and 3 at the bottom of this document for further information.</p> <p>*However, this does not apply if you are habitually resident in red countries or if you within the past 10 days before arriving in Denmark have stayed in countries or regions classified as red at the time of arrival.</p>		<p>31. <p>** Drivers may isolate themselves in the vehicle used for freight transport in accordance with driving and rest time regulation. The isolation may be interrupted in connection with the performance of work, to use toilet and bath facilities in the immediate vicinity of the isolation site, to purchase food and other necessities in the immediate vicinity of the isolation site, and to relocate to a different isolation site. October 2021</p>	<p>Foreigners who are fully vaccinated with an EMA approved vaccine, including tourists, and who can either 1) present an EU COVID-19 Vaccine Passport or 2) who are habitually resident in an EU or Schengen country or in Andorra, San Marino, Monaco or the Vatican State, an orange OECD country or a yellow third country are also exempt from travel restrictions. This means that there is no testing requirement before arrival in Denmark, nor are you required to be tested</p>	

and isolate upon entry into Denmark. However, this does not apply if you are habitually resident in red countries or if you within the past 10 days before arriving in Denmark have stayed in countries or regions classified as red at the time of arrival. Crew on aircrafts, trains, busses and ships are exempt from the requirement to obtain a test in the airport/no later than 24 hours after entry into Denmark via a sea or land border. This applies regardless of whether the person in question is a Danish citizen or foreigner. Further, this group will be exempt from isolation after entry if you travel into Denmark from green or yellow countries or regions. However, this does not apply if you are habitually resident in

			red countries or if you within the past 10 days before arriving in Denmark have stayed in countries or regions classified as red at the time of arrival.	
<p>Other:</p> <p>In Denmark, a face mask or shield is required at the airport and in the airplane. A face mask or shield is not required when using public transportation.</p> <p>Seat reservations are a requirement in all DSB's intercity and fast-trains. Seat tickets are free of charge and can be booked at train stations or online.</p> <p>When using the S-train (net of trains in the metropolitan area), it is not possible to buy seat reservations. As an alternative DSB has made a web-app that allows passengers to see if the train is filled before going to the station. The app can be found on "www.pladspaarejsen.dk".
