DECARBONISING TRANSPORT INITIATIVE (DTi)

The <u>Decarbonising Transport initiative (DTi)</u> of the <u>International Transport Forum</u> (ITF) helps governments and industry to translate climate ambitions into actions. It provides tools for decision makers to select CO₂ mitigation measures that deliver on their commitments. Specifically, it:

- Provides targeted analytical assistance for countries and partners to identify climate actions that work,
- Gathers and shares evidence for best practices that will accelerate the transition to carbonneutral mobility,
- Shapes the climate change debate by building a global policy dialogue and by bringing the transport perspective to the broader climate change discussions.

DECARBONSING TRANSPORT IN EMERGING ECONOMIES (DTEE)

As part of the DTi, the Decarbonising Transport in Emerging Economies (DTEE) project aims to help national governments and other stakeholders to identify transport measures and establish pathways to reduce transport CO_2 emissions and meet their climate goals and NDCs.

The project focuses on four ITF member countries: Argentina, Morocco, India and Azerbaijan.

The ITF is supporting their carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions reduction ambitions by designing a common assessment framework for transport emissions. The framework will cover several transport sectors and modes and will be tailored to each case. This includes the development of modelling tools and policy scenarios in close co-ordination with each of the countries' national government agencies, other local decision makers, academia, experts and civil society organisations. Capacity building will be fostered through activities including stakeholder workshops, training, policy briefs and mitigation action plans to help improve future transport research and policy development beyond the project duration.

This project will be implemented by the ITF in collaboration with The Wuppertal Institute (WI).

VIRTUAL KICK-OFF MEETING

- Formally launch the DTEE project in India and inform the relevant stakeholders about project objectives and planned activities,
- Gather input from participants regarding current and future transport challenges in India, and how they may relate to transport CO₂ reduction ambitions.
