An intergovernmental organisation with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) family, the Forum's goal is to shape the transport policy agenda, and ensure

that it contributes to economic growth, environmental protection, social inclusion and the protection of human life and well-being.

The Forum was established in 2006 by Transport Ministers in a move to globalise the then European Conference of Ministers of Transport (ECMT), which had been in place since 1953. The Forum is supported by its Research Centre that provides data and analysis on key themes.

and business at both national and international levels.


