<p>Goods:</p> <p>According to the Decision no. 17 from 23 June 2020 of the Extraordinary National Commission on Public Health, the <i>state of emergency in public health</i> is extended on the entire territory of the Republic of Moldova until 15 July 2020, with the possibility of extending the given term depending on the evolution of the epidemiological situation.</p> <p>Drivers and service personnel of the vehicles that perform transport of goods are able to enter on the territory of Republic of Moldova or transit without obstacles and are not required to comply with the self-isolation regime of 14 days, with the condition that are not showing clinical signs of respiratory infection or fever.</p>	16 May, 2020	15 July, 2020		
<p>Passengers:</p> <p>According to the Decision no. 12 from 25 May 2020 of the Extraordinary National Commission on Public Health, starting with 26 May 2020, <i>it is allowed to perform road transport of persons in international traffic.</i></p> <p>It is prohibited for the foreign citizens the entry into the Republic of Moldova through the state border crossing points open to traffic, with the following exceptions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • family members of the citizens of the Republic of Moldova; • persons holding a long-stay visa, a residence permit or a document equivalent to a residence permit issued by the authorities; 	26 May, 2020	15 July, 2020		

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • persons traveling in the professional interest, evidenced by a visa, residence permit or other equivalent document; • members of diplomatic missions and consular offices accredited in the Republic of Moldova, of international organizations / missions, as well as members of their families or personnel who can provide humanitarian aid; • persons in transit, including those repatriated as a result of consular protection. The transit route will be established by the General Inspectorate of the Border Police; • persons traveling for health and humanitarian reasons, including the accompanying person, as appropriate (with presentation of confirming documents); • cross-border workers. 				
<p>Other:</p> <p>From 08.07.2020 the following border crossing points are open for international road transport:</p> <p><u>At the border with Romania</u> Leușeni – Albița Sculeni – Sculeni Giurgiulești – Galați Costești-Stâncă</p> <p><u>At the border with Ukraine</u> Otaci-Moghilev – Podolsk Giurgiulești – Reni Tudora – Starokazacie Palanca – Maiaki-Udobnoe Ocnița – Sokireanî Larga – Kelmenți Mirnoe – Tabaki Briceni-Rossoșanî Criva – Mamaliga Pervomaisc-Cuciurgan</p>
