- outline the concept of a Road Safety Observatory for the region
- discuss the establishment of a road safety observatory in the region
- share information and experiences
- demonstrate the mutual benefits of a Road Safety Observatory in Asia



Unanimous support for the Observatory





Task force 1: A minimum set of road safety indicators.

- a minimum set of safety and crash related variables that all countries should collect at national level
- a common set of variables that will be collected at the observatory level, with the objective to create a common safety database (monitoring tool)



Task Force 2: Governance

- governance structure of the Observatory, including bylaws
- terms of reference for the host organization
- terms of reference for a Secretariat
- the funding model and the operational budget for the first three years



Structure (overview)

Annual meeting

- the decision-making body. Agreements adopted by a majority vote of the countries present at the Assembly.
- comprises of voting and non-voting members.

Steering Committee

- implementation of the decisions made by the General Assembly.
- prepare and implement the workplan
- collate road crash data
- prepare the annual report on road crash data
- support technical cooperation among Members.

Membership

- Governments in the Asia Pacific region
- Represented by the highest national public governing authority with responsibility for road safety
- Membership by expressing interest to the General Assembly.
- Non-voting members relevant stakeholders



Structure (overview)

Task Forces

- Cover specific areas of interest as agreed by the General Assembly.
- Led by the Members with technical support as required.
- Report activities to the Steering Committee (monthly report) and to the General Assembly during the annual meeting.

Secretariat

- Establish, manage and maintain the road crash database, and produce an annual report for submission to the General Assembly and Steering Committee.
- Develop statistical analysis of the road crash data and present the findings to the General Assembly
- Facilitate and conduct technical research on road safety either directly or as part of the Task Forces.
- Recruit specialist to provide inputs for the APRSO and/or the Task Forces as required.
- Set up and manage the APRSO website
- Carry out day to day operations and logistical support of the APRSO.
- Manage APRSO's budget and prepare required financial reports.
- Other tasks assigned by the Steering Committee.



Membership Objectives

- Create an platform that can help coordinate international action to address road crash data and road safety activities across the Asian and Pacific regions.
 - A formal network of governmental representatives, with the desire to take actions to improve road safety in their countries.
 - A forum to share experiences, data and information regarding road safety policies and action, to conduct joint studies and to learn from each other and to facilitate co-ADB operation.
