GENERAL COMMENT

The Republic of Slovenia complies with the requirements of the Quality Charter for international road haulage operations undertaken under the ECMT Multilateral Quota through national legislation, European Union Regulations and the implementation of appropriate European Union Directives.

SECTION 2. PROVISIONS REGARDING THE DRIVERS (Chapter III of the Charter)

A) Driving times and rest periods(Chapter III, 1):

All 43 Member Countries participating in the ECMT Multilateral Quota are parties to the European Agreement concerning the Work of Crews of Vehicles Engaged in International Road Transport (AETR) dated 1 July 1970. In the course of any international road haulage operation carried out under an ECMT licence, the undertaking and members of the crew must comply with the provisions laid down by the AETR with regard to the duration of driving and rest times and crew composition [*It is understood that compliance with these provisions are monitored through National procedures, established for the purpose of implementing the AETR or equivalent regulations*].

Any Comments: Slovenia complies with Regulation (EC) No 561/2006 on driving times, breaks and rest periods; Regulation (EEC) No 3821/85 on the fitment and use of tachographs to record compliance with 561/2006 and Directive 2002/15/EC on the working time of mobile road transport workers (which have been transposed into domestic legislation in Act Regulating the Working Time and Compulsory Rest Periods of Mobile Workers and on Recording Equipment in Road Transport). Slovenia is also compliant with Directive 2006/22/EC on requirements for enforcement.
