Background and Scope

Since 2007, the ITF Annual Consultations with International Organisations have been instrumental in fostering discussions and collaboration among the ITF and its partner organisations, spanning the transport sector and beyond. Each year more than 60 organisations are joining the discussions, both in-person in Paris and virtually.

Focused on the core themes of upcoming ITF Summits, the Consultations provide a platform for the ITF and international organisations to exchange their priority areas, while enhancing cooperation and dialogue. Since 2016, the Consultations have also included focused discussions on gender and transport, with the aim to gather input from ITF stakeholders regarding the integration of gender considerations into the Summit programme, as well as into other aspects of ITF work.

Looking ahead to the 2024 Annual Consultations, the agenda of the meeting will feature the 2024 Summit on *Greening Transport: Keeping Focus in Times of Crisis* and the 2025 Summit on *Enhancing Transport Resilience to Global Shocks*. The meeting will also provide an opportunity to present the ITF's Transport Research Programme of Work for 2024-2025 to engage with our partners to discuss research priorities, explore related synergies and avenues for collaborative opportunities in the coming years.

Against this backdrop, the 2024 Consultations will be structured around three broad thematic blocks:

- Annual Consultation on Gender and Transport, Tuesday 30 January (9:30-12:30)
- Consultation on ITF's Transport Research Programme of Work 2024-2025, Tuesday 30 January (14:30-17:30)
- Annual Consultation on the ITF Summits 2024 and 2025, Wednesday 31 January (10:00 -17:00)
